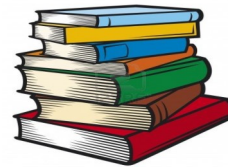

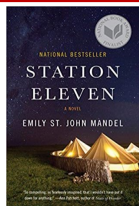


Book Swap!
