### Wine Glass & Mug Decorating Again!



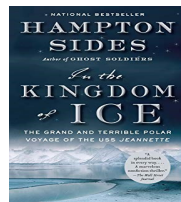
Once again this fun activity takes place at the Library. Many thanks to Bethany Hawkins for sharing her expertise with program attendees.

### Bad Samaritan (2018):

This movie did not fail to keep me on my toes. There was some blood and gore, but it wasn't uncomfortably graphic. It started as an interesting concept that I hadn't seen before, but still was a save the girl kind of story. If you like psychological thrillers, this is a good movie for you! There was implied nudity, some language, and made burglary seem like a reasonable career path for these characters.

### Red Sparrow (2018):

There was an excessive amount of sexual content and violence, so I would not recommend watching this movie with kids. I'm sure there were vulgarities used, but really, that would be the least of anyone's concerns based on the other content.
